At this interview, we'll ask you to demonstrate your teaching skills by presenting a five to ten minute 'mini-lesson' on the subject of your choice.

Candidates must also provide three references and consent to a third-party background check.

There are four application deadlines: February 1, March 15, May 1, and June 15. We make hiring decisions for applications completed by each deadline shortly after the deadline. We will accept applications after June 15th, however opportunities will be limited.

Positions fill quickly. Apply now while the courses, session dates, and locations that work for you are still available!

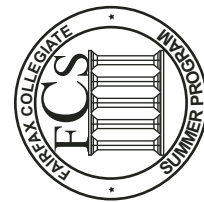

Fairfax Collegiate Summer Program

Since 1993, the Fairfax Collegiate Summer Program has provided rising 3rd through 9th grade students with challenging and engaging summer enrichment courses.

Last year, over 2300 students attended the program at seven locations throughout Northern Virginia. This year we are adding two new locations, for a total of nine: Alexandria, Ashburn, Chantilly, Fairfax, Falls Church, Herndon, Leesburg, Reston, and Vienna.

We offer over 60 courses in the following subjects: writing and reading, mathematics, science, public speaking, test preparation, robotics, computer programming, digital arts, and video filmmaking. Courses are built around creative activities that are captivating and entertaining as well as informative.

Classes typically have between 12 and 14 students and are taught by two instructors, except that writing, reading, and test preparation classes usually are taught by one instructor.

The program is aimed at average to 'gifted' students. Students are in the program by choice, and most are enthusiastic and motivated learners.

Small classes and good students simplify classroom management and make the Fairfax Collegiate Summer Program a great place to get started teaching!



Summer Opportunities

Fairfax Collegiate is hiring summer program instructors, assistant instructors, and location directors.

Most location directors are professional elementary or secondary teachers with a career interest in educational leadership.

Many Fairfax Collegiate instructors have gone on to pursue careers in education at independent schools, public schools, and Teach For America. Other instructors have applied their teaching experience in graduate programs and in a variety of challenging professions.
